The Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (KU) is a non-state university under church leadership and officially recognized by the Free State of Bavaria. It is committed to strong research and excellent teaching and combines first-class study conditions with an international focus. Eight faculties offer a wide range of subjects for around 5,000 students. The University employs 900 people of different faiths and beliefs. Grounded in the Christian view of human life, the KU aims to create an academic and educational culture of responsibility.

The Ingolstadt School of Management invites applications for the

Professorship of Economics, esp. Sustainable Economic Policy (W2 with tenure track to W3)

to be filled by the earliest possible starting date. The place of work shall be Ingolstadt. If the requirements under civil service law are met, the appointment shall be made in a temporary civil service relationship, otherwise in a private-law employment relationship according to grade W2. The civil service or employment relationship is initially limited to five years. In the event of a successful tenure evaluation, the tenure-track professor will be offered a tenured civil servant position, combined with the transfer to a W3 professorship position. Tenure-track calls at the KU are aimed at researchers in an early career phase.

The KU is committed to increasing the percentage of women in research and teaching and therefore explicitly encourages female researchers to apply.

Your responsibilities

You contribute to the scientific profile of the University through excellent research achievements in the form of publications in leading international peer-reviewed journals and peer-reviewed third-party funding. You provide high quality and innovative teaching in the degree programs of the Ingolstadt School of Management (especially in the degree program in Sustainability in Business & Economics) both in German and English, as well as in teaching economics as a minor, where applicable. In doing so, you will provide students with a holistic perspective on environmental and societal challenges facing government, businesses, or other economic players. In addition, you will be involved in the University's Third Mission strategy, cooperate with other subjects and universities as well as with non-university partners. You are willing to assume responsibility in academic self-administration.

Your profile

You have proven research expertise in applied research relevant to economic policy with a clear focus on sustainability. You use modern empirical methods in particular. You can demonstrate research success, especially through relevant publications in leading international journals. Successes in obtaining peer-reviewed third-party funding are a plus. You can demonstrate proven teaching competence and strong didactic skills (e.g. through positive teaching evaluations, certificates in university didactics, or teaching awards). You are willing to offer courses in German and English. You are closely networked nationally and internationally with other universities and/or non-university partners and research institutions. In addition, you have supradisciplinary qualifications (e.g. leadership skills, participation in interdisciplinary qualification and networking offers, high level of social skills etc.).

The requirements for employment are based on Art. 57 Bavarian Higher Education Innovation Act (*BayHIG*) and include, in addition to the general requirements of the position, in particular a completed university degree in business and economics or similar, a pedagogical aptitude, the special aptitude for scientific work, which is usually demonstrated by the quality of a doctorate in economics, as well as additional scientific achievements. In addition, since this is a tenure-track professorship, a perspective assessment of the applicant's expected scientific accomplishments may be included in the consideration of the hiring requirements of the additional scientific achievements. The successful applicant must be no older than 52 years of age at the time of appointment. The KU pursues a policy of intensive student mentoring and therefore expects its teaching staff to spend an appropriate amount of time on campus.

You can expect attractive and team-oriented activities in a cooperative working environment, creative opportunities and a diverse range of tasks as well as an attractive teaching environment with small groups and the opportunity for innovative teaching.
