The Research Training Group *Digital Platform Ecosystems (DPE)* at the University of Passau, funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG), is pleased to announce the first DPE Forum. The DPE Forum is a conference that aims to provide a venue for researchers, practitioners, and policymakers to share and discuss their latest research on digital platform ecosystems.

The DPE Forum is unique in its interdisciplinarity, bringing together academics and professionals of digital platform ecosystems from backgrounds in management, marketing, information systems, economics, communication science, and adjacent disciplines.

The DPE Forum will be held as an in-person conference from June 4 (afternoon) to June 5, 2024 in Passau, one of Germany's most beautiful historical towns, located in the heart of Europe, right at the border to Austria and the Czech Republic.

We welcome theoretical, conceptual, or empirical contributions with quantitative or qualitative approaches on the topics related to digital platform ecosystems, including but not limited to:

- Socio-economic impact of digital platforms

#### **Submission of Abstracts**

You are invited to submit an extended abstract for presentation at the conference. The abstract should be no longer than 1000 words and should clearly indicate the methodology used. Please submit your abstract via <a href="https://www.dpe.uni-passau.de/en/dpe-forum">https://www.dpe.uni-passau.de/en/dpe-forum</a> no later than 31 January 2024. The decision on acceptance will be communicated by 16 February 2024.

#### Registration

Presenters must register for the conference by the early-bird deadline on **15 March 2024** through the conference website (150 Euros for academic participants and 200 Euros for non-academic participants). The conference fee includes the conference dinner, lunch, and coffee breaks. Participants are responsible for their travel and accommodation expenses.

#### **Pre-Conference Doctoral Consortium**

PhD/Doctoral students are invited to submit a research paper for the doctoral consortium held on June 4, 9 am – 2 pm immediately before the conference. Selected PhD students will receive feedback on their papers from members of the scientific committee in their specific domain. The event also includes roundtable discussions and a wrap-up lunch. Participation in the doctoral consortium is free and includes free registration to the main conference.

Please submit your paper no later than **31 January 2024**. The decision on acceptance will be communicated by **16 February 2024**.
