The Chair investigates policy-relevant issues in development economics from a political-economy perspective and with quantitative methods. We deal with questions of international development, trade, and investment policy. We also analyze the economics of natural disasters, conflicts, migration, and international organizations. The VolkswagenStiftung supports the Chair in its further development with the research project "Tapping innovative data sources to analyze the impact of authoritarian states on global development" as part of the "Momentum" initiative. The goal is to systematically investigate the increasing influence of authoritarian states (such as China, Russia, and Saudi Arabia) in the development processes of the Global South. The Chair will foster new interdisciplinary connections between economics, political and regional sciences, informatics, and the Campus Institute Data Science (CIDAS).
